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Application Procedure

1. Parents request an interview through our online form (<http://forms.tis.ac.jp/interviewrequest.html>).
2. Parents download the application package (<http://files.tis.ac.jp/2016-17TISapplication.pdf>) from the school website and fill out pages 10 to 12. The completed form and any existing school transcripts should be brought to the interview.
3. Your child will have an assessment interview with a teacher, and the child’s parents (or guardians) will be interviewed by the principal.
4. After the initial interview, the school will decide whether or not the student should be admitted, based on the teacher’s recommendations. Notification of the decision will be given within one week of the interview.
5. If the teachers feel that they need more information to make a decision, further assessment may be arranged.
6. Once your child has been accepted, fill out the remaining pages of the application form (pages 13 to 17) and return them and any further supporting materials (immunization records, any further existing school transcripts) to the school.
7. Payment of the 20,000 yen application fee by bank transfer.

Admission Policies

*Tsukuba International School develops **critical thinkers** and **lifelong learners** by providing opportunities for **inquiry, creativity, and discovery**, where **respect** for self, others and the **environment** is a core value.*

1. Purpose of Tsukuba International School

Tsukuba International School (TIS) was founded in 1992 in order to meet the need for an English-based educational opportunity for English-speaking students in the northern Kanto area. The objectives of TIS are:

- To provide an English-based, multicultural education.
- To promote scientific and cultural literacy through a robust, well-planned curriculum in line with the principles of the International Baccalaureate (IB). We are an IB World School authorized to offer the Primary Years Programme (PYP) and the Middle Years Programme (MYP).
- To provide a safe and caring atmosphere where students can learn to work both independently and in learning communities of various sizes.
- To encourage our students to take a personal, lifelong interest in making the world a better place, by instilling in them a sense of responsibility as citizens of the world.

2. Pledge of Non-Discrimination

Tsukuba International School is an equal opportunity educator and employer. We will not discriminate against any student, prospective student, employee, or job applicant on the basis of race, color, gender, nationality, national origin, age, religion, creed, disability, sexual orientation, gender identity or gender expression. We will take measures to ensure against such discrimination in all of our services and practices.

3. Admission Qualifications

A. Age of Student

TIS accepts students in grades Pre-kindergarten (age 3) up to Grade 10 (age 16).

*This age requirement may be adjusted for transfer students who have completed at least one term of school elsewhere. In that case, the grade placement will be decided as above at the time of the interview, but may be reconsidered in light of the student's history and ability.

Students entering Pre-K must be 3 years old by December 31 of the relevant school year in order to be eligible for admission. Students must be fully toilet-trained and able to separate from their primary caregivers before they can be enrolled in the school. (Students enrolling in the Spring Headstart Program should be 3 years old by December 31 of the current calendar year.)

Students entering grade 1 must be 6 years old by December 31 of the relevant school year in order to be eligible for admission. (Students enrolling in the Spring Headstart Program should be 7 years old by December 31 of the current calendar year. Students who are age 6 and younger are eligible to enter Kindergarten for the headstart program.)

B. Student's Knowledge of English

All of our subjects are taught in English, with the exception of Japanese language classes. Our school provides an English language immersion programme. Students' English proficiency is assessed during the initial interview.

Students entering the younger years of the Primary Years Programme (e.g., pre-kindergarten to Grade 4) are expected to have some knowledge of English. They do not have to be proficient in English upon entry as it is expected that these students will gain fluency through exposure to the language in the educational context. In the final year of the PYP (Grade 5) and in all grades of the Middle Years Programme (Grades 6 to 10), students are expected to have functional English at or near grade level in order to be able to keep up with the demanding academic programme that we provide.

C. Parents' Knowledge of English

In order to honour the obligation to cooperate with the school in the child's education, at least one of the parents should be capable of communicating with the school staff in English. Full fluency is not required, but the parent must be willing to try to communicate in English. If parents have the attitude that "English is too hard", they will not be able to model a positive attitude towards English for their children.

D. Special Needs

TIS welcomes students with a wide variety of skills and abilities. However, students with special physical, academic, emotional, and/or behavioural needs will be carefully screened before admission. TIS has very limited resources to devote to children with special needs and may choose not to enroll students whose needs exceed the capabilities of the school.

4. Admission Process

- A. Parents request an interview through our online form (<http://forms.tis.ac.jp/interviewrequest.html>).
- B. Parents download the application package (<http://files.tis.ac.jp/2016-17TISapplication.pdf>) from the school website and fill out pages 10 to 12. The completed form and any existing school transcripts should be brought to the interview.
- C. Your child will have an assessment interview with a teacher, and the child's parents (or guardians) will be interviewed by the principal.
- D. After the interview, the school will decide whether or not the student should be admitted, based on the teacher's recommendations. Notification of the decision will be given within one week of the interview.
- E. If the teachers feel that they need more information to make a decision, further assessment may be arranged.
- F. Once your child has been accepted, fill out the remaining pages of the application form (pages 13 to 17) and return them and any further supporting materials (immunization records, existing school transcripts) to the school.
- G. Payment of the 20,000 yen application fee by bank transfer.

5. After Admission

A. Tuition

All students are accepted on a full-time basis. In cases when a student will not stay for a full year, and when that situation is reported to the school before the student commences study for that year, a pro-rated fee may be negotiated based on the amount of time the student will be in attendance. Please consult the school for more details. Tuition fees will be assessed on a per-term basis for any partial year that a student attends upon enrollment and refunds for early withdrawal will be given on a per-term basis.

B. Expulsion

TIS reserves the right to expel any child who does not abide by the school's rules and regulations.

C. Withdrawal

Parents who wish to withdraw their child during the school year must submit a Student Withdrawal Form in order to receive their child's permanent school records. A Student Withdrawal Form may be obtained by making an appointment with the principal. It will not be issued until all fees have been paid and all school materials returned.

School Trip Fees (2016-2017 Academic Year)

In addition to our regular educational field trips that happen throughout the year (covered by the Activity Fee), our students go on a special excursion with their classmates every year. We ask parents to contribute the following amounts for these trips. The amounts vary slightly each year based on the costs of the trips, but this is a rough estimate of the cost per grade. Parents will be informed of the actual amount, and the deadline for payment, closer to the time of their child's class trip.

Parents who chose to pay on a per-day basis must remit the payment at least one day in advance. Parents who choose to pay on a per-month basis must remit the payment before the 1st of the month. Parents who choose to pay on an annual basis must remit the payment before September 1. When the monthly or yearly rates are chosen, refunds will not be issued for days missed.
